APPLICATION OF SRILANKAN AIRLINES LTD. FOR RENEWAL OF AN EXEMPTION

Pursuant to 49 U.S.C. § 40109, SriLankan Airlines Ltd. ("SriLankan") hereby applies for renewal of its exemption from 49 U.S.C. § 41301 authorizing it to engage in scheduled foreign air transportation of persons, property, and mail from points behind Sri Lanka, via Sri Lanka and intermediate points, to a point or points in the United States and beyond, pursuant to a code-share arrangement with any duly authorized and properly supervised U.S. or foreign air carrier.

In support of its application, SriLankan respectfully states as follows:

1. SriLankan holds an exemption from 49 U.S.C. § 41301 to engage in scheduled foreign air transportation of persons, property, and mail from points behind Sri Lanka, via Sri Lanka and intermediate points, to a point or points in the United States and beyond, pursuant to a code-share arrangement with any duly authorized and properly supervised U.S. or foreign air carrier. SriLankan has code-share agreements with Etihad Airways, Qatar Airways, and American.

- 2. SriLankan requests that the Department renew its exemption for a period of at least two years, consistent with standard Department practice.
- 3. SriLankan invokes the automatic extension provisions of the Administrative Procedure Act, 5 U.S.C. § 558(c), as implemented by Part 377 of the Department's regulations, 14 C.F.R. Part 377, to continue its exemption authority in effect pending final action by the Department on this renewal application. SriLankan's exemption authority would expire on February 26, 2020, absent this renewal application, which is timely filed in compliance with 14 C.F.R. § 377.10(c)(3).
- 4. The Department has previously found SriLankan to be fit, willing and able to provide code-share services to the United States. The Department has also found that the exemption granted to SriLankan is fully consistent with the bilateral "open skies" air transport agreement between Sri Lanka and the United States.³ That agreement grants U.S. and Sri Lankan air carriers broad traffic rights and the ability to enter into cooperative marketing arrangements,

Sri Lanka and the United States and providing additional air service options for

both travelers and shippers as contemplated by the U.S.-Sri Lanka open skies

agreement.

WHEREFORE, SriLankan respectfully requests that the Department

renew its exemption as requested herein and grant it such other or further relief

as the Department may determine to be appropriate and consistent with the

public interest.
