Dear Mr. Wiese:

This letter is to inform you that the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) is unable to process your request for an exemption from § 135.145(a) of Title 14, Code of Federal Regulations (14 CFR). It explains why the FAA cannot process your request and what you should do in the next 30 days.

Why FAA Cannot Currently Process Your Request

The FAA entered your February 3, 2021, exemption request on behalf of Win Win Aviation into the public docket (No. FAA-2021-0108) but the FAA is unable to process your request any further. The information you sent does not comply with the requirements of § 11.81 (copy enclosed). For the FAA to consider the request any further, you must send the FAA all of the following:

- The reasons why the exemption would not adversely affect safety or how the exemption would provide a level of safety at least equal to that provided by the rule from which you seek an exemption.

What You Need To Do

If you want the FAA to process your request any further, you must send the information described above. FAA must receive the information within 30 days of the date of this letter. The FAA will consider the project on your request open during this 30 day period. Please note that § 11.63(d) requires you to send your petition for exemption at least 120 days before the proposed effective date of the exemption.

If the FAA Does Not Hear From You

If the FAA does not hear from you within 30 days of the date of this letter, the FAA will take no further action on this petition and consider the matter closed. If you have any questions or require additional time, you may call (202) 267-9677.
