Introduction

With this notice, we finalize the CCP process for Swanquarter NWR. We started this process through a notice in the Federal Register on November 3, 2000 (65 FR 66256). For more about the process, please see that notice.

Swanquarter NWR is on the Pamlico Sound in Hyde County, North Carolina, and was established by Presidential Order on June 23, 1932. The Service has acquired all of the property within the refuge's acquisition boundary. The refuge consists of 16,411 acres of saltmarsh islands and forested wetlands interspersed with potholes, creeks, and drains. Marsh vegetation is dominated by black needlerush and sawgrass. The mainland is forested by loblolly pine, pond pine, and bald cypress. Approximately 8,800 acres of the refuge have been designated a wilderness area. An additional 27,082 acres of adjacent, non-refuge open water are closed by Presidential Proclamation to the taking

of migratory birds. Swanquarter NWR is in the South Atlantic Coastal Plain Ecosystem and is part of the migration corridor for migratory birds that use the Atlantic Flyway. Wildlife species of management concern at the refuge include the

American black duck, lesser scaup, canvasback, redhead, surf scoter, seaside sparrow, sharp-tailed sparrow, brown-headed nuthatch, black-throated green warbler, black rail, yellow rail, clapper rail, Forster's tern, peregrine falcon, bald eagle, osprey, black bear, red wolf, Carolina pygmy rattlesnake, and the American alligator. The whitetailed deer is also a resident game

We announce our decision and the availability of the final CCP and FONSI for Swanguarter NWR in accordance with National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) [40 CFR 1506.6(b)] requirements. We completed a thorough analysis of impacts on the human environment, which we included in the Draft CCP/EA.

The CCP will guide us in managing and administering Swanquarter NWR for the next 15 years. Alternative B, as we described in the final CCP, is the foundation for the CCP.

Background

The National Wildlife Refuge System Improvement Act of 1997 (16 U.S.C. 668dd-668ee) (Improvement Act), which amended the National Wildlife Refuge System Administration Act of 1966, requires us to develop a CCP for each national wildlife refuge. The purpose in developing a CČP is to provide refuge managers with a 15-year plan for achieving refuge purposes and contributing toward the mission of the DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR National Wildlife Refuge System, consistent with sound principles of fish and wildlife management, conservation, [FWS-R9-IA-2008-N0326; 96300-1671-1988] legal mandates, and our policies. In addition to outlining broad management direction on conserving wildlife and their habitats, CCPs identify wildlifedependent recreational opportunities available to the public, including opportunities for hunting, fishing, wildlife observation, wildlife photography, and environmental education and interpretation. We will review and update the CCP at least every 15 years in accordance with the Improvement Act.

Comments

We released the draft comprehensive conservation plan and environmental assessment (Draft CCP/EA) to the public, announcing and requesting comments in a notice of availability in the Federal Register on July 3, 2008 (73 FR 38242). All comments were considered and thoroughly evaluated. Responses to the comments are contained in Appendix D of the final CCP.

Selected Alternative

After considering the comments we received, we have selected Alternative B for implementation. Under Alternative B, the preferred alternative, the refuge will continue to provide habitat for migratory birds, threatened and endangered species, and other waterfowl and fauna. Surveying and monitoring will be expanded to obtain baseline data on other species, and will include mammals, reptiles, amphibians, and fish. The refuge will monitor the effects of management activities on both flora and fauna and adapt as needed. The public use and environmental education and outreach programs will be increased to include conducting two to ten programs for local school groups. Fishing and hunting opportunities will be expanded by increasing the number of use days and introducing deer hunting with archery equipment. An interpretive trail or boardwalk will be developed to provide greater access to the public.



On behalf of Born Free USA united with the Animal Protection Institute (Born Free USA) and our members and supporters nationwide, I submit comments regarding the renewal of the permit allowing Priour Brothers Ranch of Ingram Texas, to traffic in interstate and foreign commerce, export, and kill, endangered swamp deer (Cervus duvauceli), Eld's deer (Cervus eldi) and red lechwe (Kóbus leche) raised on their commercial hunting ranch. *Federal Register* December 11, 2007 (Volume 72, Number 237).

Purpose of the Application

This application seeks to kill an unspecified number of the above referenced endangered species under the "Enhancement of Survival of the Species" exemption to the prohibition on taking of endangered species under the U.S. Endangered Species Act (ESA) of 1973 (16 U.S.C. 1531-1543). The animals in question are the products of a captive-breeding program maintained by a large commercial hunting ranch in Ingram TX. The Fish and Wildlife Service (FWS) has found that the killing of animals in similar situations may be incorporated into an endangered species sport-hunted trophy program if the program generates revenues that can be directed at conservation of the species in the wild.

While Born Free USA appreciates the legislative intent of the ESA in regards to the "Enhancement of Survival of the Species" exemption, we question whether the granting of these permits meets the stated objective. The funds generated through endangered species trophy hunting programs appear minimal, and the benefit to the species is difficult to substantiate.

However, regardless of whether a benefit to the species can be demonstrated, we oppose such hunting programs. Individual animals possess interests, and are deserving of consideration, beyond that of membership in a species. Therefore, the sacrifice of individual animals to benefit their species, while legal under the ESA, is unethical. Born Free USA is strongly committed to the conservation of biodiversity and believes it is possible to achieve that goal without compromising animal welfare.

In regards to this particular permit, Born Free USA requests that the application be rejected on the grounds that it: 1) is deficient in meeting the application requirements as stated in 50 CFR Section 17.22 (a)(1); and 2) was not submitted in good faith. Below, I will discuss each of these criticisms and offer recommendations for processing future applications for the killing of endangered species through trophy hunting enterprises.

Application Requirements Have Not Been Met

The application and supporting materials are unacceptably incomplete and vague. No information is provided regarding the number of animals of each species to be killed, the total revenue to be generated by the killing of the animals, and/or the total amount to be donated to a conservation program. Without knowing the number of animals, as well as the revenue to be generated from killing each, it is impossible for us to judge whether the amount of funds going toward conservation is reasonable.

The application materials indicate that in past years merely 5% of gross sales generated from the killing of these endangered species were donated to a conservation program, and it is unclear whether that money was spent on programs that actually contribute to the conservation of the species in question.

In our view, a 5% donation is merely token and does not justify the granting of this request. For the most part, the ESA prohibits commercial use of endangered species; therefore, the contribution should be large enough to eliminate any financial incentive for killing the animals. A donation of at least 50% of the proceeds seems appropriate.

The Fish and Wildlife Service has recognized that authorizing interstate or foreign commerce in dead wildlife or its products (including trophies) might present a risk to the survival of both wild and captive populations by encouraging the propagation of endangered and threatened wildlife for consumptive markets rather than for direct benefit to the species in the wild.

Since we can not make a determination on the basis of the information supplied as to whether the amount generated for conservation is proportional to the scope of the request, Section 17.22 (a)(1) is not met: A full statement of the reasons why the applicant is justified in obtaining a permit including the details of the activities sought to be authorized by the permit.

Furthermore, Section 17.22 (a) (1) requires: A complete description and address of the institution or other facility where the wildlife sought to be covered by the permit will be used, displayed, or maintained. The fact that multiple animals are to be taken should not negate the need to supply the addresses of where the trophies are to be ultimately displayed.

Application Was Not Made in Good Faith

The application proposes to distribute proceeds from the killing of these animals to an organization called "Conservation Force" which claims to support a conservation programs that benefit Eld's deer and red lechwe. However, no substantial proof of their contributions or conservation activity could be found. The most recent 990 form available via Guidestar is for the year 2005 and no donations were made toward the conservation of these species in that year. Further, we could find no mention on the Conservation Force website of a project benefiting swamp deer.

We are also aware that many conservation organizations do not wish to receive money from canned hunting operations and may be mislead by hunting ranches effectively laundering their money through Conservation Force. For example, Conservation Force receives money from other hunting ranches that allow the sport hunting of captive Barasingha and as a result, Conservation Force has provided funds to Wildlife Society of India for their Barasingha program (a species not covered in this permit).

However, a 2005 *Indian Express* media report entitled "Blood money from US hunters flows into Indian conservation kitty" (enclosed) clearly indicates that the Wildlife Society of India does not wish to receive funds that are generated by hunting. Affulla Kahn, professor, AMU and vice president of the Wildlife Society of India states in the article, "We get money from Conservation Force for our Barasingha programme. But we have no idea if it comes from canned hunting ranches."

Again, Conservation Force is, in essence, laundering the money from trophy hunters with the knowledge and complicity of the Service. The Service is no doubt aware of the public's disregard for hunting, especially when it is done for sport or trophies. Public opinion surveys demonstrate that approximately three-quarters of Americans are opposed to sport/trophy hunting. In a 1999 national survey commissioned by the Animal Protection Institute, 79% of respondents indicated they viewed hunting for sport or trophy as unacceptable. This finding confirmed several prior polls on the subject, including a 1995 California poll, commissioned by The Humane Society of the United States, in which 80% of those polled said they disagreed with hunting for sport or trophy, and a 1994 Arizona poll, commissioned by the Arizona Game and Fish Department, where 73% of voters said they disapproved of hunting animals for recreational reasons. Although we are unaware of any survey that has queried members of the public about the acceptance of trophy hunting endangered species, it is likely the activity would receive nearly universal condemnation.

We appreciate that conservation organizations would be concerned about the perception of a conflict of interest if it were to be publicized that they had accepted proceeds from an enterprise that kills animals, particularly endangered ones, for sport and profit. However, what we have difficulty understanding is how the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service could no recognize the fact that it has an equally serious contradiction between serving as protector of our nation's wildlife and attempting to cater to people who kill animals for their own benefit. In our opinion the Service is subverting the spirit and Congressional intent of the Endangered Species Act, and acting against the values of a very large majority of the American public, in order to satisfy a politically powerful special interest.

Recommendations

Born Free USA requests that your office immediately halt approval and renewal of this permit and all such permits until all of the issue identified above have been adequately addressed. We recommend the following specific changes to the processing of future permit applications to kill endangered species through trophy hunting: 1) Require conservation plans for each species covered in the application; 2) require complete information regarding scope of the activity including number of animals to be killed, total revenue to be generated, percent of revenue to be donated, and addresses where the trophies are to be displayed; 3) require that the contribution to conservation be significant enough to eliminate any financial incentive; 4) request a written statement from the recipient of the funds, confirming its knowledge of the funding source; and 5) renew permits based on documentation that the take is reducing the threat of extinction in the wild.

Conclusion

As stated previously, Born Free USA supports the conservation of endangered species and endorses contributions aimed at protecting species habitat, as long as the funds are not being made in connection with buying the right to kill animals.





Blood money from US hunters flow into Indian conservation kitty

Canned hunters try conservation game: One US ranch fakes donation to WII, another funds Barasingha project

NEW DELHI, SEPTEMBER 19: The Ministry of Environment and Forests (MoEF) might have ruffled diplomatic feathers by rejecting an US government proposal for tiger funds but donations are trickling in from certain American canned hunting organisations.

Texas-based 007 Ranch, through a US NGO Conservation Force, has been sponsoring a Barasingha programme run by Aligarh's Wildlife Society of India in Dudhwa Tiger Reserve and Hastinapur Wildlife Sanctuary. Florida's TRL Exotics claimed to have donated \$250 to the Wildlife Institute of India, a claim dismissed by the prestigious institute.

NGO accepts their money, many such ranches are targeting small-time NGOs and even fudging proofs of donation.

Licence renewal applications submitted to Department of Interior, US Fish and Wildlife Service—available with The Indian Express—show that 007 Ranch has been donating 10 per cent of proceedings to Conservation Force to fund a Barasingha project conducted by Wildlife Society of India, an NGO run by the faculty members of Aligarh Muslim University's Center of Ornithology and Wildlife. The latest installment of \$4,000 was handed over in November last year.

"We get money from Conservation Force for our Barasingha programme. But we have no idea if it comes from canned hunting ranches," said Afifullah Khan, professor, AMU, and vice president, Wildlife Society of India.

In its website, however, Conservation Force prominently quotes former US President Theodore Roosevelt to justify "why we hunt": "In a civilized and cultivated country, wild animals only continue to exist at all when preserved by sportsmen."

With its licence renewal application, TRL Exotics has attached photocopy of a cheque of just \$250—dated 3rd May, '05—drawn in favour of the Wildlife Institute of India for "propagation of Barasingha species".

What's canned hunting

Canned hunting is the killing of an animal in an enclosure to collect a warranted trophy for a hefty premium. The animals are often tame exotic mammals some even handraised so that they do not run from hunters. There are more than 1000 canned hunting ranches in at least 28 US states. Trophies range from numerous species of Asian and African antelope, deer, zebra to crocodile, lion and even tiger.

"Is this a joke? One, we don't accept \$250. Two, a national institute cannot accept funds without the government's clearance. Three, we won't anyway accept money generated by canned hunting. As per our reports, this cheque went to an Aligarh-based NGO. I am thinking of exploring legal options," said PR Sinha, director, Wildlife Institute of India, Dehradun.

Both 007 ranch and TRL Exotics offer Barasingha as trophies for

Dr Jamal Ahmed Khan, professor, AMU, and secretary, Wildlife Society of India, claimed his organisation never received any money for TRL Exotics. "I didn't even hear the name before," he said.

"It is preposterous for a ranch to use the name of a reputed Indian institute. And if the Aligarh NGO is indeed running their Barasingha project with funds from canned hunting groups, I strongly condemn it. No conservation effort can be fuelled by

blood," said Ashok Kumar, senior advisor, Wildlife Trust of India.

"I keep seeing advertisements of canned tiger hunt in the web. These animals' body parts get distributed around the world and encourage market for our wild stock. Of course, Indian ethics doesn't permit accepting money from canned hunters," said Dr Rajesh Gopal, director Project Tiger.

"We at WWF don't even take money from liquor companies. It is shocking that Indian NGOs should accept grants from canned hunting ranches," said P K Sen, chief of WWF-India, Wildlife programme.

Despite repeated attempts, TRL Holdings, 007 Ranch and Conservation Force officials did not comment.

On behalf of Born Free USA united with the Animal Protection Institute (Born Free USA) and our members and supporters nationwide, I submit comments regarding the renewal of the permit allowing Priour Brothers Ranch of Ingram Texas, to traffic in interstate and foreign commerce, export, and kill, endangered swamp deer (Cervus duvauceli), Eld's deer (Cervus eldi) and red lechwe (Kobus leche) raised on their commercial hunting ranch. Federal Register December 11, 2007 (Volume 72, Number 237).

Purpose of the Application

This application seeks to kill an unspecified number of the above referenced endangered species under the "Enhancement of Survival of the Species" exemption to the prohibition on taking of endangered species under the U.S. Endangered Species Act (ESA) of 1973 (16 U.S.C. 1531-1543). The animals in question are the products of a captive-breeding program maintained by a large commercial hunting ranch in Ingram TX. The Fish and Wildlife Service (FWS) has found that the killing of animals in similar situations may be incorporated into an endangered species sport-hunted trophy program if the program generates revenues that can be directed at conservation of the species in the wild.

While Born Free USA appreciates the legislative intent of the ESA in regards to the "Enhancement of Survival of the Species" exemption, we question whether the granting of these permits meets the stated objective. The funds generated through endangered species trophy hunting programs appear minimal, and the benefit to the species is difficult to substantiate.

However, regardless of whether a benefit to the species can be demonstrated, we oppose such hunting programs. Individual animals possess interests, and are deserving of consideration, beyond that of membership in a species. Therefore, the sacrifice of individual animals to benefit their species, while legal under the ESA, is unethical. Born Free USA is strongly committed to the conservation of biodiversity and believes it is possible to achieve that goal without compromising animal welfare.

In regards to this particular permit, Born Free USA requests that the application be rejected on the grounds that it: 1) is deficient in meeting the application requirements as stated in 50 CFR Section 17.22 (a)(1); and 2) was not submitted in good faith. Below, I will discuss each of these criticisms and offer recommendations for processing future applications for the killing of endangered species through trophy hunting enterprises.

The application and supporting materials are unacceptably incomplete and vague. No information is provided regarding the number of animals of each species to be killed, the total revenue to be generated by the killing of the animals, and/or the total amount to be donated to a conservation program. Without knowing the number of animals, as well as the revenue to be generated from killing each, it is impossible for us to judge whether the amount of funds going toward conservation is reasonable.

The application materials indicate that in past years merely 5% of gross sales generated from the killing of these endangered species were donated to a conservation program, and it is unclear whether that money was spent on programs that actually contribute to the conservation of the species in question.

In our view, a 5% donation is merely token and does not justify the granting of this request. For the most part, the ESA prohibits commercial use of endangered species; therefore, the contribution should be large enough to eliminate any financial incentive for killing the animals. A donation of at least 50% of the proceeds seems appropriate.

The Fish and Wildlife Service has recognized that authorizing interstate or foreign commerce in dead wildlife or its products (including trophies) might present a risk to the survival of both wild and captive populations by encouraging the propagation of endangered and threatened wildlife for consumptive markets rather than for direct benefit to the species in the wild.

Since we can not make a determination on the basis of the information supplied as to whether the amount generated for conservation is proportional to the scope of the request, Section 17.22 (a)(1) is not met: A full statement of the reasons why the applicant is justified in obtaining a permit including the details of the activities sought to be authorized by the permit.

Furthermore, Section 17.22 (a) (1) requires: A complete description and address of the institution or other facility where the wildlife sought to be covered by the permit will be used, displayed, or maintained. The fact that multiple animals are to be taken should not negate the need to supply the addresses of where the trophies are to be ultimately displayed.

Application Was Not Made in Good Faith

The application proposes to distribute proceeds from the killing of these animals to an organization called "Conservation Force" which claims to support a conservation programs that benefit Eld's deer and red lechwe. However, no substantial proof of their contributions or conservation activity could be found. The most recent 990 form available via Guidestar is for the year 2005 and no donations were made toward the conservation of these species in that year. Further, we could find no mention on the Conservation Force website of a project benefiting swamp deer.

We are also aware that many conservation organizations do not wish to receive money from canned hunting operations and may be mislead by hunting ranches effectively laundering their money through Conservation Force. For example, Conservation Force receives money from other hunting ranches that allow the sport hunting of captive Barasingha and as a result, Conservation Force has provided funds to Wildlife Society of India for their Barasingha program (a species not covered in this permit).

However, a 2005 Indian Express media report entitled "Blood money from US hunters flows into Indian conservation kitty" (enclosed) clearly indicates that the Wildlife Society of India does not wish to receive funds that are generated by hunting. Affulla Kahn, professor, AMU and vice president of the Wildlife Society of India states in the article, "We get money from Conservation Force for our Barasingha programme. But we have no idea if it comes from canned hunting ranches."

Again, Conservation Force is, in essence, laundering the money from trophy hunters with the knowledge and complicity of the Service. The Service is no doubt aware of the public's disregard for hunting, especially when it is done for sport or trophies. Public opinion surveys demonstrate that approximately three-quarters of Americans are opposed to sport/trophy hunting. In a 1999 national survey commissioned by the Animal Protection Institute, 79% of respondents indicated they viewed hunting for sport or trophy as unacceptable. This finding confirmed several prior polls on the subject, including a 1995 California poll, commissioned by The Humane Society of the United States, in which 80% of those polled said they disagreed with hunting for sport or trophy, and a 1994 Arizona poll, commissioned by the Arizona Game and Fish Department, where 73% of voters said they disapproved of hunting animals for recreational reasons. Although we are unaware of any survey that has queried members of the public about the acceptance of trophy hunting endangered species, it is likely the activity would receive nearly universal condemnation.

We appreciate that conservation organizations would be concerned about the perception of a conflict of interest if it were to be publicized that they had accepted proceeds from an enterprise that kills animals, particularly endangered ones, for sport and profit. However, what we have difficulty understanding is how the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service could no recognize the fact that it has an equally serious contradiction between serving as protector of our nation's wildlife and attempting to cater to people who kill animals for their own benefit. In our opinion the Service is subverting the spirit and Congressional intent of the Endangered Species Act, and acting against the values of a very large majority of the American public, in order to satisfy a politically powerful special interest.

Recommendations

Born Free USA requests that your office immediately halt approval and renewal of this permit and all such permits until all of the issue identified above have been adequately addressed. We recommend the following specific changes to the processing of future permit applications to kill endangered species through trophy hunting: 1) Require conservation plans for each species covered in the application; 2) require complete information regarding scope of the activity including number of animals to be killed, total revenue to be generated, percent of revenue to be donated, and addresses where the trophies are to be displayed; 3) require that the contribution to conservation be significant enough to eliminate any financial incentive; 4) request a written statement from the recipient of the funds, confirming its knowledge of the funding source; and 5) renew permits based on documentation that the take is reducing the threat of extinction in the wild.

Conclusion

As stated previously, Born Free USA supports the conservation of endangered species and endorses contributions aimed at protecting species habitat, as long as the funds are not being made in connection with buying the right to kill animals.
