I am in support of increasing protections for captive chimpanzees by granting them endangered status, which is necessary to promote the conservation of the species and protect them from continued exploitation in the United States. I thank the agency for initiating a review of the status of chimpanzees under the Endangered Species Act.

The lack of regulation of captive chimpanzees in the U.S. under the Endangered Species Act facilitates their exploitation and has led to harmful effects on both wild and captive chimpanzees.

Studies have shown that the use of captive chimpanzees in entertainment, the pet trade and invasive research contributes to the mistaken belief that chimpanzees are not in danger of becoming extinct in the wild. This translates into less urgency in protecting the wild populations.

In addition, captive chimpanzees have suffered greatly due to painful research procedures and use in entertainment and the pet trade.

Please take action to help increase protection of captive chimpanzees so that exploitation of these animals doesn't continue. Federal action is necessary to demonstrate to the rest of the world that the U.S. is dedicated to the conservation of this species.

I am in support of increasing protections for captive chimpanzees by granting them endangered status, which is necessary to promote the conservation of the species and protect them from continued exploitation in the United States. I thank the agency for initiating a review of the status of chimpanzees under the Endangered Species Act.

The lack of regulation of captive chimpanzees in the U.S. under the Endangered Species Act facilitates their exploitation and has led to harmful effects on both wild and captive chimpanzees.

Studies have shown that the use of captive chimpanzees in entertainment, the pet trade and invasive research contributes to the mistaken belief that chimpanzees are not in danger of becoming extinct in the wild. This translates into less urgency in protecting the wild populations.

In addition, captive chimpanzees have suffered greatly due to painful research procedures and use in entertainment and the pet trade.

Please take action to help increase protection of captive chimpanzees so that exploitation of these animals doesn't continue. Federal action is necessary to demonstrate to the rest of the world that the U.S. is dedicated to the conservation of this species.
